1	Welcome	
	Caroline welcomed all present, declared the meeting open.	СВ
2	EMP Update The EMP document has been revised following the site meetings and input from SANParks. Numerous international studies have been sourced and included in the documents. These studies conclude that horse-riding on designated tracks and trails is a low-impact activity. Thank you to Les Roos for sourcing the various research pieces. The EMP has also been brought in-line with international best practice. The updated document has been submitted to SANParks and their TMNP Park Manager, Mr Frans van Rooyen, has requested that feedback be prioritised by the relevant team. Following the feedback from SANParks, it is anticipated that a public consultation process will be required and thereafter the document will be available for comment for	SH
3	thirty days before being finalised. The EMP document, together with of the maps, is accessible online at www.tmef.co.za should anybody wish to view them. They were also available for comment and input at a TDRA AGM prior to its submission to SANParks. Track Maintenance	
	The track rehabilitation of the sand track below the Zwaanswyk gate was performed by the track crew and has dramatically improved the track. It was agreed that the huge cost of hiring a grader or other equipment is no longer required. The committee were very appreciative that the track crew had made such an improvement manually.	GC
	Track rehabilitation is being addressed by SANParks with temporary track closures together with alternative tracks for use during the closure periods being expected intermittently. One track in Upper Tokai was closed without consultation but was reopened immediately by SANParks following the TDRA querying the closure. The committee notes the swift action taken by SANParks to reopen the track which is appreciated.	
	The run-off water is flowing well now that the three drains under the main track above the new SANParks' offices have been cleared by the TDRA and new water bars put in. No further water erosion has been experienced since clearing the drains. The committee agreed that a drainage channel on the surface of the track is a better solution than a pipe which is very difficult to clear when it becomes blocked.	

	The dangerous spike in Lower Tokai Park that was reported by a horse rider was successfully removed.	
	Horse riders are once again asked to please report any damaged tracks needing maintenance that the committee might not be aware of so that these can be attended to.	
4	Financial Update	
4	As we have already reached the half-way point in the financial year it is appropriate to review the costs incurred year-to-date and the income received. The committee feels that prudent cash management is necessary so that there are funds available to attend to the new tracks if they are approved during the management framework review process and/or the EMP process. There are fewer than 6,000 painted wolves, or African wild dogs, left in the world today so it was decided that supporting this cause was appropriate for the Tokai Big Five Game Drive event.	мм

	Association of Property Owners as well as at a Ward level. CB has kindly volunteered to	
	take on these representations as part of her role as Chairperson of the TDRA. The	
	committee is very supportive of all efforts that will preserve and even hopefully regain,	
	the equestrian footprint that is so important to the Tokai equestrian community.
