"MISSION STATEMENT

The Association is a non-profit umbrella organisation that represents the broader riding community and related parties and interest groups in Tokai and the surrounding areas. The Association's main objectives are to;

- a). PRESERVE the tradition of horse riding in the Tokai area and surrounds, thereby supporting the longer term planning and preservation of its rural atmosphere.
- b). PROTECT the interests of any of the following that could be represented by the Association: (i) riders, owners and horses; (ii) horse related non-profit social intervention programmes; (iii) and the currently constituted Tokai Branch of the

Pony Club (a non-profit organisation) or other such similar organisations and (iv) any other appropriate future sub committees, organisations and taskforces deemed requiring protection.

c). PROVIDE community-based, multi-purpose equestrian facilities in Tokai.

- d). PROMOTE recreational riding and all disciplines of equestrian sport.
- e). COMMUNICATE and negotiate with organisations relevant to any of the above."

The committee felt that it was important not to lose focus on the mission of the TDRA. A lot of effort has been made over the last year to ensure that all of the objectives as stated in the mission statement are being met. This has been done through initiating the EMP back in 2018 and subsequently supporting the EMP process as this has unfolded; actively participating in the management framework review process; arranging various horse-riding activities in Tokai Park such as the Tokai Big Five game ride, full moon sunset ride and Easter Egg Hunt; undertaking regular maintenance to the tracks that horse-riders enjoy in Tokai Park; education campaigns in conjunction with other user groups and training courses for the grooms who are entrusted with the care of our horses.

After reflecting on the TDRAs mission, the committee agreed that we are not a show holding body; there are other organizations that are much better placed and suited to running shows. The TDRA will therefore ensure its focus is on other non-competitive events to promote recreational riding.

Members are encouraged to put forward suggestions for activities or events that you would like the committee to consider. It is envisaged that one event per quarter will be offered to continue to promote horse-riding, build a sense of community and benefit the broader community.

Maintenance has been undertaken on a regular basis and will continue to be done on this basis as this is working well. Some of the priority items for the first quarter include the clearing of alien vegetation that is growing across track one in Middle Tokai and clearing blockages in the various waterways before winter in an effort to minimise the flooding that could result.

Members are requested to please alert the committee to anything that you notice that requires maintenance or repairs.
